JOB DESCRIPTION

Purpose

The Public Involvement Coordinator will work under the supervision of Dr Lorna O'Doherty and a team of researchers at the Centre for Advances in Behavioural Science (CABS), Coventry University, in collaboration with the University of Bristol and University of Birmingham and several external organisations, including charity bodies and the NHS, to conduct an National Institute for Health Research (NIHR) funded study to evaluate Sexual Assault Referral Centres (SARCs) across England. This study, undertaken within the thriving research environment of the Centre for Advances in Behavioural Science, represents the most extensive evaluation of SARC services to date. Using a range of methods and wide stakeholder engagement, it will generate much-needed evidence of the impacts of different forms of sexual violence on the health and wellbeing of adults and children who receive support from SARCs. The study is expected to have important implications for health and policing/criminal justice policy and practice.

Main duties and responsibilities

- Setting up, coordinating and promoting Patient and Public Involvement (PPI) across the life of this new national study funded by the NIHR and based in the West Midlands by:
- initiating a new PPI group made up of individuals with lived experience of abuse or with experience of supporting survivors among family/friends, to contribute to the research project
- working with charity sector partners to identify and invite PPI members to contribute to the PPI group and as peer researchers, and coordinating and supporting PPI training days
- refreshing the PPI pool as needed and briefing PPI members as appropriate at different stages of the project (e.g. ahead of PPI group meetings and advisory group meetings)
- debriefing PPI members as appropriate following PPI and advisory sessions and research work
- 2. Reviewing study materials such as protocols, information sheets, and consent forms for sub-studies as required, as well as ongoing review of website and other promotional material and communicating with the project team about appropriateness of materials, content and approaches for service users

- Attending networking events, keeping up to date with developments in the sector and generating ideas and new opportunities for progressing best practice PPI over the life of the project
- 4. Collating and writing PPI meeting papers, planning meeting agendas, booking rooms and refreshments, taking minutes, chairing meetings, and liaising with the research team as required
- 5. Leading development of a PPI 'case study' over the course of the project and communicating about this
- 6. Comply with GDPR regulations and show a commitment to personal development in order to deliver high quality work
- 7. Support the administrative needs of the project and project team as appropriate
