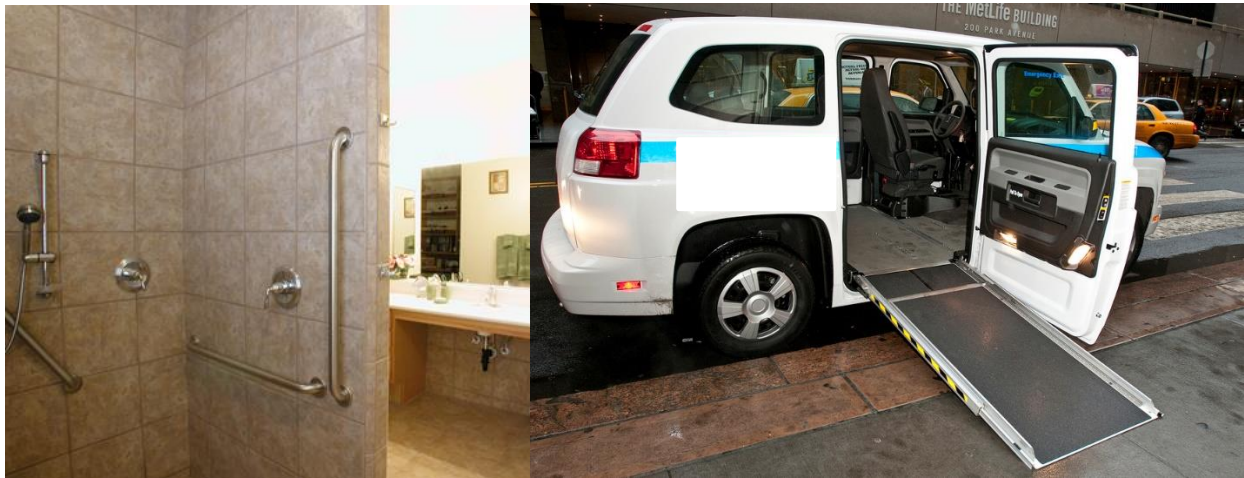


Are you interested in helping to design a study investigating how Adult Social Care Services can improve how they gain the views of clients and carers?

I am an Associate Professor in Gerontology at the University of Southampton, and I am applying for a research grant from the National Institute for Health Research.
