Background

Radiotherapy is high-energy x-ray treatment.

Radiotherapy is a key part of modern cancer treatment, used in about 70% of patients.

The aim of treatment is to deliver the best radiotherapy dose to the tumour and to deliver as little dose as possible to the surrounding normal tissues.

Over the past decade, there have been many improvements in radiotherapy technologies, which help us deliver radiotherapy more precisely and accurately.

We are evaluating improvements in radiotherapy to see how patients may benefit.
