



## Invitation to join our Citizens' Panel! Help us understand how a national patient safety policy is rolled-out in the NHS in England

### *What is this policy?*

In August 2022, NHS England published the Patient Safety Incident Response Framework (PSIRF).

This new framework sets out how NHS organisations should respond to patient safety incidents. The aim is to develop better ways to respond to and learn from patient safety incidents, so that they don't keep happening.

The framework represents a significant shift in the way the NHS responds to patient safety incidents and is a major step towards establishing a safety management system across the NHS.

### *What is the Response study?*

We are funded by the National Institute for Health and Care Research (£1.65million) to evaluate how this patient safety framework is rolled-out in the NHS in England.

Our 3 year research project started on the 1st May 2022.

### *Why form a Citizens' Panel?*

It is common to have groups of patients and members of the public involved in research studies as advisory groups.

The Citizens' Panel will act as the public's eyes, ears and voice; a group of 'critical friends' to the Response study research team.

The Citizens' Panel will support wider discussions about the findings of the research and what they mean for fairness, equality, equity, diversity and inclusion.
