What is the MACRO programme?

Funded by the National Institute of Health Research, MACRO is a research programme which aims to find the best treatments for adults with CRS, both with and without nasal polyps, for managing common sinus disease.

We have completed work helping us to better understand current pathways of care, patients and doctors' views on current treatment options and their benefits and limitations, and a large trial which compared medical and surgical treatments for CRS. We are now considering all our research findings to help improve the care of adult patients with CRS.

What is public involvement in research? Public reviewers; raising research quality!

As a person with a specific health condition or as a member of a particular community, you are in a unique position to share insights and experiences that researchers might never have considered, potentially altering their perspectives. Making a difference in research so that it genuinely helps patients can be even more impactful than medicine itself.

What are we doing?

- To provide recommendations on treatment pathways and guidelines based on the study's results
- To give regular updates to the PPI Panel on the study's progress, findings, and recommendations
- To give the opportunity for PPI Panel to ask questions, seek clarification, and provide feedback during meetings
- To promote patient-centred care and improve the overall patient experience.
- o To identify areas for improvement and ensure ongoing engagement and satisfaction.

Panel members who have a genuine interest in improving the management of chronic rhinosinusitis and are willing to actively participate in meetings and discussions.
